## **INTRODUCTION**

Jan Swasthya Sahyog (JSS), is a voluntary, non-profit Organization, registered as a society in 1996. For the past 25 years we have been working towards trying to improve the health and nutrition status of rural people especially the poor and marginalised, through various interventions, among them:

1. A community health program, providing preventive and curative services, based on 144 trained village health workers, selected by their respective villages, in 72 tribal villages.
2. Low cost, effective, Clinical Services which include
  - a. An outpatient clinic at Ganiyari, self sufficient with a pharmacy and radiology and laboratory services, that has provided extremely low cost care through more than 8 lakh consultations to over 4 lakh patients drawn from more than 2500 villages (approximate population 15 lacs)/towns of Chhattisgarh as well as adjoining districts of eastern M.P like Anuppur, Dindori, Shahdol, and has emerged as a centre for low cost, but high quality comprehensive medical, surgical and obstetric care in the region.

**b.** An inpatient ward with 150 Beds and an operation theater complex (including 3 major operation theatres and a Labour Room) which has been functional since June 2001 and has provided high-quality surgical services to more than 38,000 patients. Nearly 70 to 80 vaginal deliveries are conducted every month at the centre. Nearly 2500 major surgical operation are performed annually at this hospital, ranging from Cancer Surgeries, Urology and Gynaecology to Pediatric and Newborn Surgery, Orthopaedic and Plastic Surgery.

**c.** Three subcentres in three forest village clusters, about 45-75 km from Bilaspur town, which serve more than 150 forest and forest-fringe villages that are manned by two senior health workers and two nurses are supported by doctor based outreach clinics every week .

**3.** Appropriate field and clinic based operational, observational, and action based research into priority public health problems particularly childhood illnesses, sickle cell disease, tuberculosis, malaria and leprosy.

**4.** Running Training programs for other voluntary organizations and the government's health workforce which include community health workers, Advanced level health auxiliaries, C.H.O., Nurses, Laboratory technicians, non formal medical practitioners and doctors.

**5.** Acting as a Technical Resource Group for the Government of Chhattisgarh, the Planning Commission, and other agencies.

**6.** Advocacy. JSS has been involved in advocacy for primary health care and rational pharmaceutical policy, comprehensive care for patients with sickle cell disease and TB as well as highlighting the centrality of chronic hunger as India's most important and persistent public health problem.

**7.** Running a Phulwari program in which over 200 Crèches focusing on children under 3 years of age are being cared for, with village support in the forest related villages with the aim of improving nutrition, early child education, inculcating hygienic practices and supporting the working parents.

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### **EXAMINATION**

Examination will be conducted by the Pt. Deendayal Upadhyay Memorial Health Sciences and Ayush University, Raipur Chhattisgarh. At the end of every semester the examination will be conducted by the University on the subject covered during the respective semester. Degree will be awarded by University.

### **INTERNAL ASSESSMENT/EXAMINATION REGULATIONS**

The students' progress is continuously assessed through written test (i.e. model exam, unit test, pre. University exam) assignments, class presentations, seminars and project work in class room and clinical area. For each subject 25% of the total marks in theory and 50% of the total marks in practical are assigned to internal assessment, which is sent to the university prior to examination and is added to the marks obtained in the final examination. The candidate has to pass separately in internal and external examination.

A candidate has to pass in theory and practical exams separately in each of the paper.

A candidate must have 100% attendance in each of the practical areas before award of degree.

## LIBRARY

**BSc Nursing has a 4 year teaching program followed by a 6 month mandatory internship. The annual fee at JSS is Rs 92000 (tuition fee, fooding lodging etc. all included). JSS will sponsor 50% of the annual fee for the four years for candidates who will agree to serve the organization for 2 years after finishing the 4 years of training program.**

Few motivated and meritorious candidates will be offered 100% scholarship, provided they are willing to gain experience and serve in the organization for 4 years after completion of the course.
